2024 NAPLAN

Congratulations to our Year 3 & 5 students and staff on our outstanding NAPLAN results. Our students scored above network and like-schools in all aspects of the NAPLAN assessments. These results reflect the hard work and efforts of our students, but also the dedication of our staff school wide. This data is a result of years of hard work including strategic resource deployment, planning and explicit teaching. As a school community we are very proud of our collective efforts to support our students to achieve their best!

2024 PARENT OPINION SURVEY

The Parent Opinion Survey is conducted annually by the Department of Education and is distributed amongst parents at every school in Victoria. This year all parents will be invited to participate, that is one parent per household. The survey helps our school gain an understanding of how you view our school climate, student engagement, and relationships. The results are used to inform school planning and improvement strategies. All responses to the survey are anonymous.

The survey will be conducted online by ORIMA Research Pty Ltd and only takes 15 minutes to complete. It can be accessed from Monday 29th July - 30th August and is available in English, and a variety of languages.

Parents will receive a notification via COMPASS with login details to complete the survey on the day.

Survey results will be sent back to our school by DET at the end of September. The Parent Opinion survey results are shared with School Council each year and will be available via the Annual Report to the School Community available on the school website in 2025.

Ms Shaw is currently completing her Master of Psychology and is on a 2 day a week placement for 16 weeks. Ms Shaw will support the work undertaken by the school wellbeing team led by Mrs Atkinson.

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL CURRICULUM/PYP...

Our term has started strong, with our Middle School students commencing their swimming program last week. Over the next 2 weeks students in Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 will attend the swimming program.

Our year 5 students have participated in their first two 'STOMP' sessions which will enhance their inquiry under the Transdisciplinary Theme of How We Express Ourselves.

On Wednesday our Senior students went to Mount Eliza Secondary College to see their Seussical performance and by all accounts it was fantastic.

Our whole school Olympics day was held on Tuesday. Classes came dressed in colours representing their chosen country and participated in activities and Coach Approach sessions to make it a fun filled day. A special thanks to Ange Seaburgh for all of her organisation for this day.

NAPLAN

Schools have now received their NAPLAN results and these have been sent home to parents and carers. It is *important that you keep a copy of these results* as you may require them for future reference when applying for secondary schooling etc.

NAPLAN measures student achievement in Numeracy, Reading, Writing, Spelling, and Grammar and Punctuation. These results are presented within 4 proficiency levels: Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs Additional Support.

Each set of NAPLAN results is an important milestone, but it's also important that students know that one result does not define them – these results are about making sure every student gets the support they need so they can continue to get the best from their learning.

As a school, we have performed exceptionally well in NAPLAN in 2024, with results across all areas being above network and similar schools. We will receive state comparison data in late August. The below table shows the percentage of students who are performing in the exceeding and strong proficiency levels.

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FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL ... WELLBEING

Welcome back to Term 3, it is hard to believe we are halfway through the school year already.

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

MENPS is committed to promoting and embedding Respectful Relationships and gender equality into our school's ethos, vision and values. In our school the focus is on treating everyone with respect and dignity in the hope of creating real and lasting change in the lives of our students, staff, families, and the wider school community. One way we support this endeavour is through the teaching of the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships curriculum. Topic 1 - 6 focuses on supporting students with their social and emotional development. Topic 7 and 8 have a specific focus on gender and gender relations.

During Term 3 and 4 students from Foundation to Grade 6 will be working through the curriculum that focuses on Gender and Identity and Positive Gender Relations. The content of the lessons is age appropriate and delivered in a sensitive manner by your child's teacher. Due to the nature of these topics, I felt it was important that parents are informed to be prepared for questions that might arise at home.

Topic 7: Gender and Identity				
Learning activities within this topic assist students to challenge stereotypes and critique the influence of gender stereotypes on attitudes and behaviour. They learn about key issues relating to human rights, gender, identity and focus on the importance of respect within relationships. The activities promote respect for diversity and difference.	Exploring stereotypes helps us understand how they influence our attitudes and behaviour. We learn about: -Gender stereotypes -How gender stereotypes can influence our attitudes and behaviour -Issues relating to human rights, gender/ identity -the importance of respect within relationships -diversity and difference.			
Topic 8: Positive Gender Relations				
Learning activities within this topic focus on building an understanding of the effects of family violence and focus on the standards associated with respectful relationships. Students develop the skills needed to solve problems, set boundaries within relationships, and play an active role within the prevention of family violence. They develop peer support and help-seeking skills that can be applied in response to situations involving gender-based violence in family, peer, community or on-line relationships.	 Respectful relationships are key to preventing family violence. We learn: -about the effects of family violence and what we should expect in a respectful relationship. -We develop skills to help prevent family violence, including how to: solve problems set boundaries within relationships. -We practice peer support and seeking help when gender-based violence occurs. 			

There are many resources that can be used at home to facilitate these conversations although I find picture story books are an excellent staring point.
