Dear Parents and Carers,

Following on my previous announcement of my retirement in 2025, I would like to thank parents for their kind words and wishes. I must admit I am looking forward to having more time to myself, but I know I will greatly miss my job as Principal of Mount Eliza North Primary School.

Open School Afternoon

Yesterday we opened the school to the community to share and celebrate our students learning. It was lovely to see so many families visiting classrooms and specialists' rooms, and to see students proudly sharing their learning. For some this was playing maths games, reading poetry and for others we enjoyed a puppet show! Congratulations to all our students and teachers for their work this term!

Nurturing independence and resilience in our students

Term 4 is the perfect time for our Foundation students to demonstrate their independence by walking themselves to and from their classroom each day and unpacking their school bags. We also encourage our parents to utilise the kiss and go zone at the front of the school before and after school. That is, in the morning give your child a kiss and send them on their way!

A change in supervision after school

A teacher's working day finishes at 3.45 two days a week and at 4.45 when we have planning or meetings after school. All staff are required to attend planning and meeting sessions. This has meant a change to supervision after school.

Students will be supervised by teachers in the yard after school from 3.30 - 3.45pm. Any students who have not been picked up by 3.45 will be taken to the office. Parents will need to collect their children from the office. This change is in-line with the current workplace agreement.

Communication

Effective and efficient communication between the school and home is collaborative, and is based on open communication, trust, respect and a shared responsibility for the education of our students.

If parents would like to meet with their child's teacher, we encourage you to send an email to organise a mutually convenient time.

When sending emails to teachers, you can expect a reply within 3 working days. There is no expectation that staff read or respond to emails after hours.

The time before school is usually a busy time for teachers as they are setting up their classrooms and getting organised for the day. A pre-organised time ensures that adequate time is available for conversations.

Let's hope we get some warm Spring weather!

In Term Four we are going to focus our PLC work on encouraging positive behaviour by looking at feedback approaches and recognition of the many great decisions our students make each and every day. We will spend time discussing ways to further embed a culture of respect for every member of our school community. Wishing you amazing holidays and we look forward to seeing everyone return in Term 4.

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL ... WELLBEING

As part of our ongoing efforts to create a supportive and positive learning environment, we are excited to announce that our school will be focusing on the theme of **Respect** for the upcoming term. This initiative aims to foster mutual understanding, kindness, and positive interactions both in and outside the classroom.

What will our focus be?

Throughout the term, we will incorporate lessons and activities designed to help students:

- Understand the importance of respect for themselves, their peers, teachers, and the school environment.
- Learn respectful communication emphasising listening, empathy, and treating others with kindness.
- Develop problem-solving skills promoting peaceful resolution of conflicts and cooperation.

Practice respect in daily routines – in the classroom, during play, and in the broader school community.

How We Will Achieve This:

- 1. Classroom Activities: Teachers will integrate respect-based lessons into the school day, using stories, role-play, and group discussions to highlight respectful behaviour.
- 2. School-wide Initiatives: Regular teaching of the Respectful Relationships curriculum and discussing examples of respectful behaviours during daily circle times.

Recognition Programs: Students will be recognised for demonstrating respectful behaviour by being nominated for a KUDOS award.

How Parents Can Support at Home:

We believe that a strong partnership between home and school is essential to fostering respectful behaviour in children. You can support our efforts by:

- Encouraging discussions at home about what respect looks like in different situations.
- Modelling respectful behaviour in everyday interactions.

Praising your child when they demonstrate respectful behaviour at home or in the community. We aim for our focus on respect in Term 4 to serve as a strong foundation for a positive and successful start to 2025.

Chris Crewther Member for Mornington Inspires Year 4 Students with Real-Life Stories

Recently, our Year 4 students had a special guest visit: **Chris Crewther!** As part of our **Unit of Inquiry** about how people create systems to meet the needs and wants of the community, Mr. Crewther shared how different systems—like transportation, education, and government—help communities work well and support people's needs.

Mr. Crewther explained that these systems don't just happen by chance—they are carefully planned to make sure everyone's needs are met. His visit helped us understand how important these systems are in our everyday lives and why they matter for our community.

He also talked about the importance of **resilience and persistence**. He shared stories from his own life about how staying strong and never giving up helped him succeed. This was a great reminder for our students that working hard and sticking with something, even when it's tough, can help them achieve their goals.

We were also excited to meet **Donna** (his office manager) and her training guide dog, **Plato**. Donna shared her story about how Plato will help people with vision impairment. The students were amazed to learn about Plato's special training and how guide dogs play such an important role in helping people with specific needs.

Mr. Crewther's visit, along with the story of Donna and Plato, made our **Unit of Inquiry** come to life. We learned how real-world systems and support networks work, and how important it is to help others in the community.
